

YOU AND YOUR ASSOCIATION.

Did you know that evidence of an active and viable national class association has a significant effect on the status of your class among yachtsmen? It follows of course that the value of your investment is enhanced.

Apart from ensuring that annual championship regattas are staged, a class association endeavours to continually improve its yacht in other ways. For example most associations affilliate with state yachting authorities and so keep abreast of safety measures, handicapping procedures, and many detailed yachting developments. Associations act as a communications vehicle allowing members from diverse locations, sailing on very varied waterways, to exchange ideas, problems, information, aimed at making yachting more enjoyable.

Associations are usually run by a small committee of about three enthusiasts. But no matter how enthusiastic is this small band, the result will be dismal unless there is a good, sustained response from members. "You reap what you sow" is a most apt addage. There is plenty of indication at present that the RL 24 Owners Association is becoming complacent. With a new committee due to be elected next month there will undoubtedly be a fresh approach to running things. New enthusiasm generated by the comraderie existing at the National Regatta is often shortlived unless a measure of response is forthcoming from members - You. So this is an impassioned plea from your current committee to get behind next years administration. Please think about communicating - a paragraph of RL gossip, an account of a cruise, race reports, accidents on the water, criticisms, jokes, photos, go fast ideas, fittings and gadgets, gear for sale, things that went wrong, rules, handicapping, what you would like to see changed. ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING.

The Victorian Association AGM will be held at the Rhyll Yacht Club at 7 pm on Friday, January 11, 1985.

SUNDAY ISLAND RACE.

The annual race at Port Albert, circumnavigating Sunday Island, again attracted a large fleet of trailable yachts this year. Five RL's were entered and revelled in the moderate breeze with Peqasus (Bruce Castles) sailing his usual consistent race to finish 2nd over the line, 15 seconds behind a well sailed Noelex and third overall on corrected time, only seconds ahead of Russell Wallace's Karingal. Understand Russell is delighted with his new sails! Lowana VI is reported to have an excellent underwater shape for picking up the Port Albert kelp??

GEELONG TO QUEENSCLIFFE.

About 12 RL's took part in this Annual Trailable Yacht classic. The very light conditions resulted in a shortened course even though it was downhill most of the way. The finish at St. Leonards saw Lowana VI the 8th yacht across the line closely followed by the 9th yacht - Pegasus. We do not have corrected time results but the Shannons must be well in it on Lowana's performance.

N.S.W. NEWS.

Norm Rodgers writes from Lismore, news of sailing on the Richmond River :

"Our club is now racing eight 24's and one 28 with another 28 being fitted out. A Norge 23 with RL24 topside modified with standard mast and sails is expected to take to the water this month. Robb Legg has offered a trophy for the RL class to be awarded on a handicap basis. Currently Rob's previous boat Sequoia is off scratch at .713 with slowest boat off .622.

Our collective data would seem to support the view previously expressed in 'National News' that the drop keel racers are under-rated at half percent faster than the swing keeler. It may well be that ,713 is a realistic rating for comparison with other race designed trailer classes which raises the question of re-rating the swing keelers around ,703 or so.

around ,703 or so. We usually race over a 5 nautical mile course near the mouth of the Richmond River at Ballina. Three laps in average breezes is completed in about three hours. We have the option of expanding the lap distance up to about eighteen nautical miles by sailing up river as far as Wordell where the Pacific Highway spans the river. Unfortunately the river is not sufficiently wide to set a large triangular course but we can set small triangles for variation and currently have ten variations of the standard course in addition to the long lap options. In good weather it is quite safe to venture to sea.

Ballina has good holiday facilities and is popular with cruising yachtman. It may be possible for us to recommend it as a site for a championship in the future "
