

### NEWS FROM LAKE WELLINGTON.

A very successful regatta was held over the week-end of 27/28th. April with a strong fleet of 24s. The regatta was the annual K.R.Rainey Trophy for personal handicap boats. Ohau-Rua, Wings, Lowana VI, Sasha, Streetcar, Encounter and Anitra, as well as a dozen Tasars and a dozen mixed T.S. competed.

Not often you get 4 Australian National Champions in one race! (It was very unusual for *Pegasus* not to be sailing or it would have been 5.)

So you can imagine how hot the racing was, with a different winner for ean of the 3 races. However the RL fleet had to lower their colours to a very well sailed Castle 650, *Time Bandit*, sailed by past Commodore Barry Phillips.

On Saturday there were many brilliant "acts" put on by each boat crew.

The RL owners should consider this week-end next year as LWYC has free camping facilities and excellent racing. (The wind did not exceed 8-10Kn for the entire W/E.) The Rainey Family have been long supporters of the RL24 class and this regatta has been named in (the late) Ken's honour.

On the club championship front Bruce Castles in *Pegasus* narrowly won from a Sonata 26, with the result going down to the last race of the year! ( A good result seeing a lot of the club championship races were held in light winds.)

We have yet another RL, Anitra, with new owners Peter & Corin Howman. The boat is no stranger to LWYC, but the Howman family are from Western Aust.

While still on the East Gippsland results, Sasha won the GLYC Easter Classic. The competition was very hot. Ken is still the master but he is being very hotly pursued by a number of good RL sailors.

The RLs are still a very popular class at LWYC and anybody wanting to come up next year would be assured of plenty of good racing, and lots of help and advice.



### CONGRATULATIONS.


