2017 RL24 N.S.W. State Championship REPORT

The three heats of the NSW RL24 State Titles were sailed over two consecutive weekends in November 2017. Heats 1 & 2 were sailed on the 18th & 19th November 2017 at Illawarra Yacht Club in conjunction with their Lord Mayor's Regatta. The final heat of the 2017-2018 NSW State Championships was sailed on the following weekend, Sunday 26th November 2017 on Kogarah Bay and was hosted by the Kogarah Bay Sailing Club. A total of 6 RL24s sailed over the series.

Heat 1 on Saturday 18th November saw three RL24s start in a North Easterly wind that strengthened form 10 knots to 15 knots. At the start, *Ringleader* sailed by Colin Boylan, Amy Boylan and Jenyne Norris gained the best of the start and was leading well up the first work when disaster struck as the bottom rudder gudgeon sheered off. It was a quick drop the sails and motor back to the club house to pull *Ringleader* out of the water and replace the broken gudgeon. Ron Kerr sailing *Hello Sailor* with Scott Haig and Hamish Kerr capitalised on the withdrawal of *Ringleader* and quickly establish a comfortable lead over *Shaka* which was sailed by Robert Winn with crew Tim Boylan and Max Heggens. At the finish *Hello Sailor* had a 3 minute lead over *Shaka*.

Heat 2 on Sunday was a Passage Race around the whole of Lake Illawarra with an 11.00am start. An Easterly course was set and the start was close between all 3 RL24s. As the race progressed the fleet experienced wind direction changes to the North East then back to the east and then to the South east. Wind strength varied from 4-5 knots at the start, 10 knots on the first run, back to 3-4 knots on the second work, then up to 15 knots on the tight sky spinnaker run from the middle of the Lake right down to the southern end of the Lake to round the Oak Flats mark, then it was a long beat back to the Channel for a Club House Finish. The winds had lightened off again and the final work up the channel was challenging with up to 10 tacks required. *Ringleader* had its full crew compliment on board with Colin Boylan, Tim Boylan, Amy Boylan and Jenyne Norris. Robert Winn on *Shaka* had a full crew of Rebecca Winn, Judy Van Der Gest and Max Heggens and *Hello Sailor* had Ron Kerr, Hamish Kerr and Scott Haig on board. *Ringleader* establish a good lead on both *Hello Sailor* and *Shaka* at the first mark. On the first spinnaker run, *Hello Sailor* snuck past *Shaka* into second place and they held onto second for the remainder of the race. At the finish, *Ringleader* was 9 minutes ahead of *Hello Sailor* with *Shaka* about 1 minute 30 seconds behind *Hello Sailor*.

The **final Heat 3** of the NSW Titles was sailed on Kogarah Bay and hosted by Kogarah Bay Sailing Club. The Race Committee set a North East course which saw the fleet start in front of the club house and then sail to the top of Kogarah Bay as a windward beat. A short square run followed to a mark near Carss Park and then a tight reach past the club house all the way south to a mark at Captain Cook Bridge. From here it was a three quarter run up the Georges River to a mark at Tom Ugly's Bridge. After rounding this mark, it was a long work back past the club house to the mark at the top of the Kogarah Bay. All 4 RL24s racing on Kogarah Bay had a good close start. By the first mark *Treasure* Island sailed by James Stevens and his crew had gained a small lead over Cresent sailed by Tony Thoms and crew with *Ringleader* sailed by Colin Boylan and crew around third. *Shrek* sailed by Dave Robinson and his crew was round in 4th place. All boats were still close on the square run to Carss Park. On the tight reach to Captain Cook Bridge, *Treasure Island* put in some distance from *Cresent*, *Ringleader* and *Shrek.* On the first three guarter no boats carried spinnakers and the placings remained the same. The second lap saw the 4 RLs maintain their placings. Both *Treasure Isaland* and *Ringleader* carried spinnakers on the three quarter run between the bridges. On the final lap, both Treasure Island and Cresent pulled further ahead of Ringleader and Shrek. Cresent, a regular at Kogarah Bay, gained a little on *Treasure Island* on the final work to a club house finish. On corrected time in Heat 3, Cresent sailed by Tony Thoms and crew finished first with Treasure Island sailed by James Stevens and crew finishing second - a close 57 seconds behind. Third place went to *Ringleader* who was three minutes further back sailed by Colin Boylan and crew with Shrek sailed by Dave Robinson and crew in fourth place.
