Treasurer's Report: TREASURERS REPORT 2022 – 23

This year is seeing increased financial activity leading up to our special 50th Anniversary Regatta. Last January the Colac Sailing Club hosted our national titles. The cost was \$1,500 as a fee to cover the club's operating costs for the regatta, with the inclusion little extras by way of thank you gifts to acknowledge the work of the CSC committee. Total outlay by the RL 24 Owners Assoc for the event was \$1,638. Plus a photography fee of \$75.

Throughout the year the Association outlaid for all the usual running costs of the organisation. Australian Sailing – class affiliation \$226.12 - Consumer Affairs \$60.10 - Secretarial expenses \$40.09 including \$15.09 postage for RL stickers to our USA sister organisation.

The Association also encouraged the RL sailing community by providing financial support for the NSW state titles by way of \$150 towards running costs. Also the QLD state titles through a generous re imbursement of entry fees from LCSC of \$125, to RL24 Owners Assoc. to be passed on to Mr Van Deudekom to cover trophy costs.

Income from membership fees which includes one year and three year membership options is \$2150 (from January 2022 to December 2022).

Our 50th Anniversary has generated one off costs to cover the production of our E book with \$96.75 spent on digital publication using USB memory sticks. It is encouraging that pre orders for the

E book have already reached \$190. Outlay for special commemorative plaques for competitors \$322.30. Other income streams include commissions from sale of RL24 clothing through Volley Ball Warehouse.

Upcoming costs for regatta management and operations with Southport Yacht Hollywell, photography costs etc. will be forthcoming over the next month.

I would like to thank President Wayne and the committee for their help and support, in particular Colin Boylan for his dedication to the Association.

In summary with the RL24 Owners Association bank balance currently \$10,717.29 (December) we are in a sound financial position.
